It's a very busy time for everyone at school at present as we work our way through all the tasks required before the completion of the school year. As well as normal lessons, student reports, school concert, Year 6 dinner, school disco, Fun Day, *Clunes Got Talent* and Year 6 Final Assembly, we are also dealing with Annual Financial rollover and the myriad other administrative tasks that need to be finalised. It would be of immense benefit to us if all outstanding accounts were finalised early next week and outstanding permission notes were returned promptly, as we currently spend a lot of precious time chasing up notes.

Each year, students of Year 6 and their parents/caregivers are invited to share a meal (prepared by Year 5 parents and served by Year 5 students) with Clunes School staff. It is a wonderful social occasion which marks the conclusion of primary education for our Year 6 students and for families who have been associated with the school for a number of years. The event is for Year 6 students, Year 5 students, who are serving the meal, and associated adults and no-one else. Younger or older siblings are not invited. Last year we had issues with children who had accompanied parents and were left to roam the school grounds, unsupervised. Clearly, this creates an unacceptable level of risk and the potential for disaster and it cannot happen again!

After the Year 6 dinner concludes, the disco commences. It is for all students enrolled at Clunes

Public School only; older or younger siblings do not attend. A supervision issue occurred in relation to the school disco last year. Children were brought to school too early and then left to their own devices, presumably, in the optimistic (but unrealistic) belief that nothing unfortunate would happen to unsupervised, excited children running amuck in the school playground. As anyone who works with children can tell you, it's not like that in the real world and the potential for disaster is immense.

The disco commences at 7:00pm. **Do not drop your child/ren off at school earlier than this.** 

The Year 6 Farewell dinner and the school disco occur at different timeslots on the same day-Thursday, 6<sup>th</sup> December. This year, I do not wish to be placed in the position where I need to contact parents who have dropped off children too early for the school disco; or of asking parents to leave a dinner to supervise their children who should not be on the school site; and I'm sure parents do not wish to be embarrassed in front of their peers. So please get your babysitting arrangements organised now and we can all have a safe, enjoyable conclusion to the school year!
