# Mac n Cheese Muffins

Ingredients: 6 eggs, 1/2 cup natural yoghurt, 1 1/2 cups dried macaroni pasta (cooked to packet instructions), 1 cup corn, 1 large zucchini (grated), 1 large carrot (grated), 1 cup grated low fat cheese, solt and pepper to taste

Method: Proheat oven to 180 degrees and grease a muffin tin well with oil. Put all the ingredients in a large bowl and mix until well combined. Divide mixture evenly between the muffin holes. Top with a little extra grated cheese. Bake in oven for 25 minutes or until set and golden. Allow to cool in tin for 15 mins before turning out to cool completely.
