I am writing to you to convey some ideas of what to add and improve in Heritage Park. I think these are great ideas and I'm sure you will too.

Firstly, I strongly believe that in the empty space where the old playground was there should be some equipment for older children. At the moment the play equipment is mostly directed at the smaller kids. Do you really think that big kids don't want to have fun?

Secondly, I think that there needs to be some equipment for the disabled. Kids who have a disability aren't any different to other children when it comes to wanting to have fun, and at the moment they can't do that.

Thirdly, let's not forget the beautiful fig tree which is so iconic to Heritage Park! Kids love climbing it, and adding a treehouse and ladders would make it even more amazing!

Fourthly, I think that having toilets and change rooms close by are a must now that the water play area has been added. A baby-changing room would also be great, for all those smaller children who also want to have fun.

Lastly, I strongly believe that we should consider how hot it gets during summer. The new playground has no shade whatsoever and I think that is a major problem. We do not want people getting too hot, and some shade will prevent that from happening.

As you can see, there are many great ideas here which could be used in Heritage Park. I talked to my friends about these ideas and they loved them. "Heritage Park would be so fun with all of these cool additions!", said Zeke Treehouses, extra play equipment and nice shady areas are great things for beautiful community spaces like this one.
