In the afternoon, Year 6 will be watching their movie at school, and all other students will be having Christmas parties. PROPOSED CLASS STRUCTURES AND STAFFING FOR 2022

Although class structure is subject to change due to new enrolments, with financial planning and staff allocation organisation we have been able to form four classes in 2022.

Mr Priestley will be on the **5-6 class** (Stage 3). The principal will also be teaching on class 2 days a week. Mr Priestley will be filling the Teaching Principal role until Mrs Slee returns from extended leave at the end of week 7 Term 1.

Mrs Smith and Mrs Northey-Manser will be on the 3-4 class (Stage 2).

We had a strong response to our 3day-a-week, Stage 2 teacher position and we are very pleased to announce the successful applicant is Mrs Rose Smith. Mrs Smith will be working 4 days a week in the first 7 weeks of Term One and we are sure the team-teaching combination with Mrs Northey-Manser is a winner. The two have already started planning to make sure quality teaching and engaged children are at the heart of all they do in 2022. We have worked extensively with both teachers and know they are team players who also contribute to whole school programs. Ms Hutchinson will be on the **1-2 class** (Stage 1)

Mr Sky will be on Kindergarten (Early Stage 1)

Fridays will enable different grouping and special interest groups with literacy and other focuses. Groups include K/1, 2/3, 4/5/6. Fridays also always include sport and either assemblies or SRC, Ethics and non-scripture on alternate weeks. Smaller cohorts are also conducive to greater individualised learning.

Considerable planning has gone into this structure, and programs and further planning will be finalised before students return to school in 2022.

We are also pleased to announce, Mrs Heather Jessup is the successful applicant for our 3day-a-week position while I am on extended leave in the first 7 weeks of term one. Mrs Jessup is a very dedicated staff member who has shown herself to be a quality teacher, committed to whole school programming and events.

Office staff

Mrs Berni Cooper will remain as School Administration Manager 4 days a week for Semester One, and Mrs Andrea Pearce will be relieving School Administration Manager one day a week and School Administration Officer / Library Assistant one day a week.

Our permanent School General Assistant will not return until March, and Mark Thomson will continue three days a fortnight over the holiday period.

Music

Miss Fiona will not be returning to our school as our band tutor, as she will be working full time at Southern Cross and Lennox Head Primary Schools which are closer to her home. We want to thank Miss Fiona for the musicality she has



brought to our school over the years. She has been the link to students experiencing musical instruments, participating in large choirs and enjoying authentic experiences such as Lismore Performing Arts Festival and the Creative Arts Camp at Lake Ainsworth. We thank her for her tremendous work and wish her a very successful and musical future without Covid -19 regulations to hinder creativity.

We have attached a flyer from the Lismore Conservatorium and will be seeking Expressions of Interest in 2022 as we know Music plays a significant role at Clunes Public School.


TEA TOWELS
