Our 4-5-6 students are enjoying their collaborative Enterprise work and are looking forward to the workshop at Southern Cross University on Wednesday.


Students will also learn from one of our own community members who is a local successful entrepreneur. More details soon.

This week at Clunes OSHC we have been engaging with technology by using the iPad to create drumbeats and melodies. The children used a Drum Pad app to make the different sounds. They recorded loops then faded sounds in and out forming the songs. The children made melodies for the songs using Garage Band recoding their songs and splicing them together to get the complete number one hit.




The children also used the iPad to follow instruction on making paper planes. They each chose a different design to compete in a paper plane throwing competitions. Some of the children used their own paper plan designs and all the planes flew well. Some of the children hypothesized on why some flew better than others and refolded the planes to get more lift or more power.
