Mandatory Vaccination Update for Schools

At today's webinar with the Deputy Secretaries, it was stated clearly, staff would be required to be vaccinated by 8th November 2021. As well as staff, all community volunteers e.g. canteen, swimming school, reading helpers, P & C committee, uniform shop volunteers etc must be vaccinated to enter the school site.

Coaches and Afterschool Care, cleaners, all NDIS service providers (such as speech therapists) and internal workshop presenters must also have their completed vaccination certificates.

Rule to remember:

If you need a Working with Children Check you will need a vaccination certificate.

P&C News





School shutdown is also a chance to make better relationships with our children and teenagers. One-on-One time is free and fun. It makes children feel loved and secure, and shows them that they are important.

Set aside time to spend with each child ⊙_____

It can be for just 20 minutes, or longer – it's up to us. It can be at the same time each day so children or teenagers can look forward to it.

Ideas with your baby/toddler

- Copy their facial expression and sounds
- Sing songs, make music with pots and spoons
- Stack cups or blocks
- Tell a story, read a book, or share pictures

Ask your child what they would like to do

Choosing builds their self confidence. If they want to do something that isn't OK with physical distancing, then this is a chance to talk with them about this. (see next leaflet)

> Switch off the TV and phone. This is virus-free time

Ideas with your teenager

- Talk about something they like: sports, music, celebrities, friends
- O Go for a walk outdoors or around the home
- Exercise together to their favorite music

Listen to them, look at them. Give them your full attention. Have fun!
