TERM 3 REGULATIONS

This term we have been directed to adhere to the following protocols by the NSW Dept. of Education.

Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms should be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptomfree. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test Thank you for your assistance with keeping our school community safe and healthy.

RAPID ANTIGEN TEST KITS

The Dept. of Education has provided additional kits for families. Early next week each child will receive one kit of 5 nasal tests to take home.
