The P&C has a number of ideas for this canteen, but we need help running it.

#### Here's what we need:

- 1 person to help lead the organisation on the day and the prep. If this sounds overwhelming, don't worry, we have expert canteen organisers who can be on hand to provide guidance and a run sheet.
- 8-10 people on the day for about 2 hours each. This will include a little food prep and basically staffing the canteen.

All we need you to do is flag your interest and we will organise it with you to suit you.

We are also putting the call out for <u>baked goods</u> again. It'd be great to be able to provide the kids things like muffins (savoury and sweet), cup-cakes, pastries (e.g. cheese and spinach) and quiches, including some vegetarian, vegan and GF options.
