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## Reports distributed today

K – 6 students will receive reports today. We ask parents and carers to look carefully at the achievement and effort descriptors to ensure they understand the report. A “C” means your child is achieving at a level appropriate to their stage of learning. A “D” means there are some areas they are still developing. A “B” means they are working at the top 10% of their year (early or late stage) and an “A” means they are working above Stage level. The **effort** is the most important grading as it tells you whether your child is working to their full potential, and application should be celebrated. If you would like to discuss the report with your teachers, please contact the school and the teacher will chat with you in the last week or early next term.

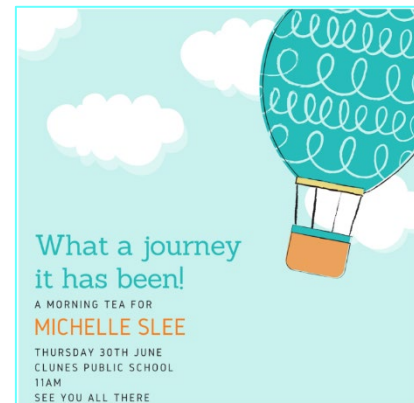
